

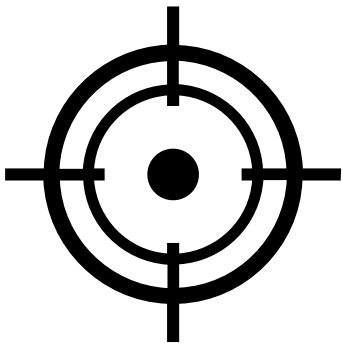

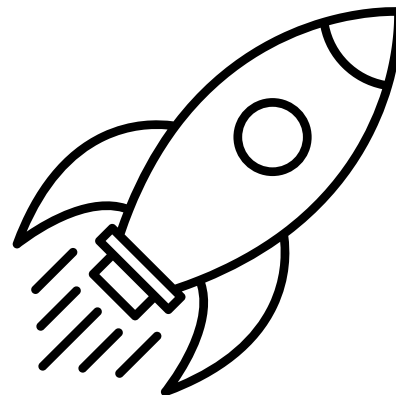

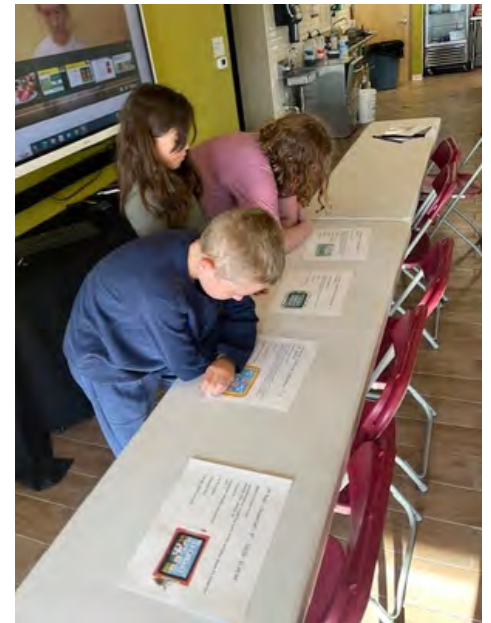

GOIN ON A ROAD TRIP??

You may be hitting the road with the family this summer! To keep everyone occupied, here's a few fun car-ride games that everyone will enjoy!

Name the Artist

The first person to correctly answer the name of the artist or group from a playlist or playing on the radio scores a point.

In My Suitcase

The first player begins by stating, "I'm going on vacation, and I packed..." with an object starting with the letter A. The second person adds to the list alphabetically, still repeating the original items listed beforehand, and so on for each player. The first person to mess up the packing order loses the game!

Road Trip Scavenger Hunt

This game may require making some stops, depending on what you list in your scavenger hunt. For example, some choose to put items like "coffee from a rest stop" on their list. This game can be prepared in advance by very organized parents!

Starter for 10 Drawing Game

Each person starts with a blank piece of paper and one person draws a crazy shape on their paper, then traces it onto everyone else's piece of paper. You all have 1 minute to turn that shape into something. Add eyes, limbs, wheels, hats. It's the time limit that adds the pressure.

The Color Game

A great one for younger kids. Choose a color among yourselves and then try to spot it on your drive. This can be absolutely anything, such as a sign, a car, a house, you name it. Just please don't get ridiculous and say sky if the color is blue. The person who spots the color first gets a point. Once you arrive at your destination, the person who has the most points wins.

Telephone

Tell the person next to you a secret, and have them pass it on. When it gets to the driver, have him say it out loud. You'll laugh at how the message has changed.

The Geography Game

The first player says a name (can be city, state, country, river etc.) the next person has to say a name starting with the last letter of the previous name.
