



New Mexico State 4-H "Alternative" Shooting Sports Championships Rules

Due to Covid 19 and current NM Department of Health orders and New Mexico State University directives, an alternative to our State 4-H Shooting Sports Championships will be offered to our 4-H Senior members for a state competition and qualify teams for the National 4-H Shooting Sports Championships if they happen. All 4-H activities will follow all regulations and restrictions for their specific county dealing with Covid safe practices and will be adhered to without alterations. Teams will complete the course of fire exactly as it is stated in these rules in their home county qualifier and will submit targets or scores depending on the discipline to the State 4-H Office by May 3, 2021. In the event that we can gather in groups of 20 or less, in a specified location, we will take the top four (4) teams in each discipline this summer to determine the top teams and determine final team placings. If current health restrictions prevent us from being face to face, all mail in scores will be used for team and individual awards as well as determination of national teams. All individual awards will be taken from scores sent in and not at the "finals" to allow all participants to be eligible.

General Rules:

- Counties are limited to two teams (3 or 4 individuals) per discipline.
- Youth may participate and submit scores in up to two disciplines only.
- There will be a \$10.00 per contestant/discipline entry fee for the contest. This
 fee will cover postage, targets, awards and costs of putting on the "alternative"
 contest.
- Teams will shoot the specified course of fire in their **home county qualifier** and targets or scores will be submitted to the State 4-H Office by May 3rd by the County 4-H Agent.
- Teams will send in Orion targets for smallbore rife, air rifle and air pistol.
 Muzzleloading and smallbore pistol will send in targets. Archery and Shotgun will send in the official scorecard. All targets and scorecards will be provided by the State 4-H Office and all targets are due in the State 4-H Office by May 3rd.
- Contestants participating in the Hunting discipline will take an on-line exam. Once registration is done, counties with hunting teams will receive information and instructions on steps to complete the contest on Canvas. The contest should be open April 19th-30th unless otherwise noted.
- County Agents will witness all competitions and sign off that all rules and regulations were followed in the conduct of the contest.
- All paper targets and scorecards can be obtained through the State 4-H Office.
- Entries must be approved and verified that youth are enrolled in the project by the County Extension Agent responsible for 4-H.

- Youth may participate in the same discipline in which they have participated in any previous 4-H National Invitational, but they are not eligible to go back to National Contest in that event as per national rules.
- By entry in these events, the County Extension Agent is verifying that the youth entered are knowledgeable and proficient in the safe use of the equipment and the fundamentals of the event. Range officials may dismiss or disqualify a participant if he/she believes the participant does not demonstrate the basic proficiency and knowledge required.
- By entry in these events, the County Extension Agent is verifying that the youth entered are representatives of their respective counties and have met those counties guidelines for qualifying to shoot in the state contest.
- No changes to team roster will be allowed unless by the County Extension Agent.

- There will not be any ammunition provided for this contest.
- All participants must be senior age 4-H members as of January 1, of the current year. (Senior: Ages 14-18. A 4-H member must have passed his/her 14th birthday <u>or</u> be 13 years old and in the 8th grade but cannot have passed his/her 19th birthday by January 1 of the current 4-H program year.)
- Youth that are not 14 as of January 1, of the current year are <u>not</u> eligible for National Competition.

- Cell phones will not be allowed on the ranges for any reason.
- No military or assault type firearms will be allowed at the State 4-H Rifle Shooting Contest. This is due to safety and the image of the New Mexico 4-H Youth Development Program.

ARCHERY MATCH EVENT

Under the alternate State Shoot format FITA will be the only event

- Recurve
- Compound

Recurve and compound archery are different competitions with different teams BUT will shoot the same event. Even though the two governing bodies for the two events have slightly different requirements or restrictions-for the sake of simplification- this 4-H match will use one standard for equipment – for all events. Procedural rules, course of fire, scoring, etc. will follow the NGB unless otherwise noted.

	Shaft location - The location of the shaft in the target will determine the point value of the shot. Shafts touching a higher value scoring zone/line will receive the higher score.
	Initialing the score card - Both the scorer and the shooter will initial the score card to affirm their agreement on the score awarded.

Additional criteria for mail/distance shoot

- Only score cards provided by the State Office will be accepted as valid for the State Shooting Sports Championship.
- Score cards must be signed by the shooter, scorer(s) and Extension Agent.
- All score cards submitted will be evaluated for individual recognition/placement.
- Ties will be broken in the following order: number of X, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1. If a tie still exists the following method will be used to determine final placement in the order listed: Total score at 60m, 50m, 40m, 30m, first end score 60m, 50m, 40m, 30m.

SMALLBORE RIFLE MATCH

General Rules:

- All smallbore rifles are required to have the action open and a CBI (Clear Barrel Indicator) in place when the rifle is not being fired and is uncased. Either commercial or personally made flags are permitted.
- Cased rifles will be the last equipment to be brought to the range and the first to be removed from it.
- Official weight of a rifle will be determined with the magazine inserted in the rifle.
- .22 rifle contestants please be aware that there can only be 2 participants sharing a rifle and **not used in the same relay**.
- Youth, parents, and leaders will be given one verbal warning for a safety violation or behavior. If the offense happens again they will be asked to leave the contest and will not be allowed to finish the contest.
- No military or assault type rifles will be allowed at the State 4-H Rifle Shooting Contest. This is due to safety and the image of the New Mexico 4-H Youth Development Program.

NRA THREE-POSITION

Target	Orion Target TAR0041 – Provided by the State 4-H Office
Course of Fire	20 shots in each position – prone, standing and kneeling in that order at 50 yards. Totaling 60 record shots
Time Limit	One (1) minute per record shot prone, two (2) minutes per record shot standing and one and one-half(1 ½) minutes per record shot kneeling Time is not checked on each shot. The time allowance is computed for a complete stage (including sighting shots); Prone 20 minutes, Standing 40 minutes, Kneeling 30 minutes.
Equipment	Rule 3.2-any .22 caliber rimfire rifle chambered for .22 short, .22 long or .22 long rifle cartridges may be used in smallbore 3- position. No restriction is placed on barrel length or overall weight of rifle and accessories. If a rifle is equipped with a magazine, no more than five (5) rounds may be loaded

	in the magazine at a time. Slings may only be used in the prone and kneeling positions.
Sights	Metallic sights, non-corrective
Ammunition	Solid point (40 grains) standard velocity – match or target ammunition

Coaching: Coaches will be back behind the shooting area at a distance, as designated by the CRO, and will not be allowed to contact the shooters during any of the firing periods including during sighter shots. If the shooter wishes to consult with the coach during the firing or sighting period, they may ask the range officer to be excused and step back off the line where they can meet with their coach and have discreet discussion where it does not interfere with other shooters, but the clock will still be running.

How to use Orion Target:

- When hanging targets, use push pins only, no staples.
- Use care when handling targets, they tear easily.
- All rifle targets will be scored by an official team of individuals selected by the State 4-H Office and not by individual counties. The targets will be scored electronically by the Orion system. It is critical that the targets remain clean from debris, as much possible, to ensure accurate scoring.
- To prepare target for submission, tear the target along perforated line. Note: only the four record shot bulls will be submitted. Do not submit the sighter bulls (two top bulls).
 Paper clip the four record bulls (four bottom bulls) together for each position, by participant.

AIR RIFLE MATCH

AIR RIFLE EVENTS

- 1) All air guns are required to use a CBI (Clear Barrel Indicator) when the gun is not being fired. (It is strongly recommended that CBI be bright orange.)
- 2) Only wadcutter & domed pellets are allowed ... No hunting pellets
- 3) Each event is equally weighted ... 600 points are possible in this contest

- Use care when handling targets, they tear easily.
- All rifle targets will be scored by an official team of individuals selected by the State 4-H Office and not by individual counties. The targets will be scored electronically by the Orion system. It is critical that the targets remain clean from debris, as much possible, to ensure accurate scoring.
- To prepare targets for submission, <u>paper clip</u> the three targets together for each participant.

AIR PISTOL EVENTS

All events are "single pistol" matches, meaning participants are to shoot the entire course of fire of that event with the same pistol. No pistol changes will be allowed between stages. Only one pistol per shooter allowed on the line. When not cased and not in use all air guns are required to use a CBI (Clear Barrel Indicator) in place except as permitted by range officer.

SLOW FIRE -BULLSEYE

DISTANCE	10 meters
COURSE OF FIRE	40 shots, 10 shot strings, 5 shots per bull
TIME LIMIT	1½ minute per record shot (15 minutes per string)
	10 min preparation time, 15 min for unlimited sighting shots.
EOUIPMENT	Any 4.5 mm (.177 cal.) compressed air, CO2 or pneumatic air pistol that conforms to the pistol specifications listed here or in the NGB rules Pistol weight: 1500-gram maximum (3.3 lbs.) Trigger pull weight: 500-gram minimum Pistol must fit within confines of a box having inside dimensions of 420mm x 200mm x 57mm* (approximately 16.53" x 7.87" x 2.25"). Only open sights are allowed. Optical, mirror, telescope, laser-beam, electronically projected dot sights, etc. are prohibited. *(50 mm modified to 57 mm for 4-H, to accept standard Daisy air pistol grips)
SHOOTING POSITION	The athlete must stand free, without any artificial or other support, with both feet and/or shoes completely within the firing point. The pistol must be held and fired with one (1) hand only. The wrist must be visibly free of support.

- 1. The highest number of inner tens;
- 2. The highest score of the last ten (10) shot series working backwards by 10-shot series in full ring scoring (not inner tens or decimals) until tie is broken.

How to use Orion Target:

- Use push pins and not staples, when hanging.
- Use care when handling targets, they tear easily.
- All pistol targets will be scored by an official team of individuals selected by the State 4-H Office and not by individual counties. The targets will be scored electronically by the Orion system. It is critical that the targets remain clean from debris, as much possible, to ensure accurate scoring.
- To prepare target for submission, paper clip the eight record targets together for each participant. Do no submit the two sighted targets.

SMALLBORE PISTOL MATCH EVENTS

The Youth Safety Handgun Act, as included in the Gun Control Act of 1968, puts restrictions on the use and possession of handguns by youth under 18 years of age. Youth participating in National 4-H Shooting Sports Invitational must, at all times, follow all provisions of this act. Therefore, event officials will require "the prior written consent of the juvenile's parent or guardian who is not prohibited by Federal, State, or local law from possessing a firearm." This written permission must be in possession of the youth – even if a parent/guardian is present. We suggest a simple statement, reduced to wallet size with the name of the youth, a parent's name, address, as well as their signature, and that of a witness and dates. The participant can laminate this card and keep it with the shooting kit or on their person. This document must be displayed at check-in. Failure to have this document will require the National Championships Committee to disqualify the shooter to avoid violation of federal law.

All smallbore pistols are required to use a CBI (Clear Barrel Indicator) when the handgun is uncased and not being fired. Cased pistols will be the last equipment to be brought to the range and the first to be removed from it.

All events are "single pistol" matches, meaning participants are to shoot the entire course of fire, with the same pistol. No pistol changes will be allowed between stages, and only one pistol per shooter is allowed on the line. Pistols may be replaced only if they are disabled or malfunctioning.

.22 pistol contestants please be aware that there can only be 2 participants sharing a pistol and **not used in the same relay**.

A Production Firearm is one which is or has been a catalog item readily available to the general public equipped with factory notch and post sights. All standard safety features of firearms must operate properly. The firearm shall have no visible internal or external modifications except as noted in the NGB rules. Barrel length, including cylinder, not more than 10 inches. Trigger pull not less than 2 pounds. .22 caliber rimfire – long rifle Open sights only (4-H National Championship match rule). Rear sight may be adjustable, but sight radius no more than 10 inches.

SHOTGUN EVENTS

- There will be no toleration with any firearms on your toe or on any magnetic or leather pads. At no time shall the muzzle come in contact with the ground and must be kept in a safe direction. If any competitor is seen with a muzzle on his or her toe, or if they are not controlling their firearm, THEY WILL BE DISQUALIFIED!
- No release triggers permitted.
- Tie breakers will be done for high point individual only.
- No reloads, only factory ammo permitted in shotgun.

TRAP

Event	Standard ATA (American) trap (16 yards)	
Course of Fire	4 rounds (100 targets) consisting of five targets from each of five shooting stations at 16 yards per round.	
Shoot offs	Five targets from stations 1 and 5 from the 21 yard line. Management may increase the distance to 27 yards if required to break ties.	
Time Limit	Shooters will fire in an expeditious manner, avoiding unnecessary delay and should be prepared to take the field up to 1 hour prior to listed start time.

Additional criteria for mail/distance shoot

- Only score cards provided by the State Office will be accepted as valid for the State Shooting Sports Championship.
- Score cards must be signed by the shooter, scorer(s) and Extension Agent.
- All score cards submitted will be evaluated for individual recognition/placement.
- Any ties for first place will be decided by the longest string of consecutive hits. In the event a shooter shoots a perfect score of 100, that individual must remain on the station and continue to shoot until a miss occurs.

MUZZLE LOADING RIFLE MATCH

- All firearms must remain in case until given permission to remove by Range Officer (RO).
- All ramrods must be marked clearly to tell if a firearm is empty or has a load. We should be able to clearly and easily identify the difference between a loaded and unloaded firearm.
- Unless actively loading or firing, a ramrod shall always be placed in the firearm.
- If needed, coaches are expected to help clear or fix a firearm, WITH approval of RO.
- No one may touch, clean, move, or load any rifle while anyone is down range.
- Any "one-hole group" shall **immediately** be brought to the attention of a RO.
- Only the competitor may challenge a shot or score.
- No unsafe rifles will be allowed to compete or continue a match.
- Once a match is started, a rifle may not be switched out unless it is declared unsafe or a malfunction. If so, it is no longer able to be used for the day.
- No "alibis". If you fail to load properly, all effort will be given to help clear the firearm, as quickly as possible, but does not allow added time to your match.
- Malfunctions (does not include improper loading) have up to 20 minutes to repair or replace rifle. Make up time may go to another relay to prevent other shooters having a delay of match.

EQUIPMENT	Rifle: Any traditional or non-traditional NMLRA Conventional muzzle loading rifle (in-lines permitted);
	Sights: Metallic – non-traditional permitted (open or aperture);
	Position: Standing –no slings;
	Ramrods: No wooden ramrods allowed;
	Ignition: percussion cap, or flintlock. Number 209 primers are permitted; Maximum charge of 60 grains of black powder or its equivalent is allowable. There are no limits on the caliber.
	All events are restricted to patched rounds balls only.
	Spotting scopes are permitted.
NGB RULES	NMLRA Muzzle Loading Rifle, Pistol and Shotgun—except as noted (January 2020 Edition). No open powder containers are permitted on the firing line except when powder is actually being measured. Any open container will become the property of the range officer. A separate powder measure must be used to carry the powder from the container to the muzzle of the gun. Powder is to be measured by volume, not weight, on the line. No pre-measured loads allowed. No rifle may be capped or primed until on the firing line and the command to fire has been given by the range officer. No wooden ram rods are permitted on the firing line to load or clean guns.

COURSE OF FIRE	15 shots standing. Sight-in shots permitted, but as part of the total running time.
TIME LIMIT	60 minutes total running time.
PROJECTILE	Patched soft lead round ball only.
SCORING	Highest scoring area touched by ball. Note: The latter is less stringent than standard NMLRA scoring.

This is a national hunting skills evaluation. Any species covered in the listed resources may be included in the contest, including any game or furbearing animal north of Mexico in North America. Participants may expect some focus on species found in the host state, but events will only include species found in the listed resources.

The 2021 "Alternative" hunting competition will be a virtual written knowledge exam utilizing NMSU's CANVAS online course system. Questions will incorporate subject matter from resources listed in the New Mexico 4H shooting sports hunting skills event rules.

The test will consist of 50 question exam and will include the following

- Up to 30 hunter decision making questions,
- Up to 10 orienteering questions and
- Up to 15 wildlife ID and management questions.

Each question is worth 2 points for a total possible score of 100. Highest score determines final rankings. No shooting discipline, walking orienteering course or walking wildlife ID course will be held during the Alternative online event. If an in person state championship is allowed, the archery shooting discipline, walking orienteering courses, walking wildlife ID and management course and a hunter decision making event will be utilized.

- 1 Highest score on orienteering section
- 2 Highest score on wildlife section
- 3 Highest score on hunter decision making section
- 4 Total number of questions missed in the orienteering section

- 5 Total number of questions missed in the wildlife ID and management section
- 6 Total number of questions missed in the hunter decision making section
- 7 1st odd numbered question missed starting at question number 1
- 8 1st even numbered question missed starting at question number 2

For team rankings consisting of top 3 scoring individuals results

- 1 Highest score of drop score
- 2 Highest scoring team in orienteering
- 3 Highest scoring team in wildlife ID
- 4 Highest scoring team in hunter decision making
- 5 Highest overall individual score of 3^{rd} place member from respective teams 6 Highest overall individual score of 2^{nd} place member from respective teams
- 7- Highest overall individual score of 1st place member from respective teams.

If an "in person" state championship event is held and a tie occurs on team scores, the overall ranking from the Alternative online event will be utilized to finalize team standings. I.E. the higher ranked team entering into the "in person" event will be awarded the higher rank.

Once registered for the contest, contestants will be given instructions on how to register and take the test on the on-line Canvas platform at NMSU. Teams will need to register for a time slot within a specified period of time and this will be a timed event meaning participants will have only so much time to take the test. More information will be given as we get closer to the actual event in April.
